— Václav Špála Gallery and Josef Sudek Studio:
PPF Art provides a year-round programme of exhibitions at these famous Prague galleries.

— PPF Group's photography collection:
probably the largest private collection of Czechoslovak and Czech photographs, which currently counts over 1 900 works by 170 authors. The core of the collection is made up of photographs by the world-renowned Czech photographer, Josef Sudek.

— PPF Group's art collection:
a collection of 333 works of art by Czech artists from the past two centuries, such as A. Mucha, J. Schikaneder, M. Medek, I. Ouhel, T. Čiśařovský, P. Nikl, and others.

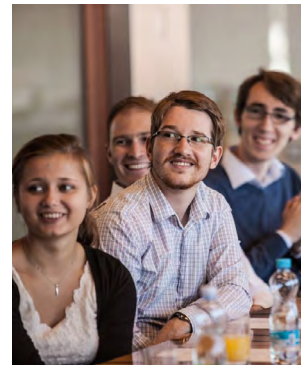
